## What's new around Camp Courtney?

### Here's the Rainy Season

It was officially announced the rainy season started on 28Apr.

The rainy season usually lasts until around "Irei no hi" (Memorial Day for the War Victim) which is on 23June.

#### <u>June bride</u>

After the rainy season, you might be invited to an Okinawan wedding party.

We usually bring "Wedding money" in a special envelope to the party.

They're sold at any 100yen store.

Before you buy the envelope, ask your Okinawan/Japanese friends for some help and advice.

You can choose simple envelopes which are easy to use; however, I prefer the well decorated ones for weddings. Red/white (with gold or silver) decorated ones are for happy events; however,

Pre-"kanji" written on the top might be for "New baby", "Recovery", "Congratulations" and others.

Make sure to note the purpose before you buy!


\*Black/white(with silver sometimes) decorated one is for a funeral or memorial service.

1) Put your money in the inner envelope. 1,000- 10,000yen bill is average in Okinawan wedding \*However, even-number like 20,000 is not good. "Dividable" number is unlucky for newlyweds.

\*prefer to using brand-new bill or un-fold-ish bill

- 2) Write the amount of money on the front of the inner envelope in "old fashioned-Kanji" if you can.
  - 3) Write your name and address in the left side on the back of the inner envelope.
    - 4) Write your name in the center below on the wrap envelope.
      - 5) Put the inner envelope in the wrap envelope.
    - 6) Make the bottom flap over the top flap so that "the luck goes up"

\*for funeral/memorial services, it's the opposite. The top flap comes over the bottom one.



Hello, my name is Alexandria, and I am an Ambassador in Girl Scouts. I have been a Girl Scout for ten years. Two years ago I got my Silver Award by planning an eco-fashion girl leadership summit that culminated in the climb of Mount Fuji. This year I am earning my Gold Award. A Gold Award is the highest honor a Girl Scout can earn.



I would like to improve the appearance of my military community by getting rid of all of the animal feces lying around Camps Courtney and McT. I walked around on two occasions, and counted up the all the poop I found: I found 71 piles on camp Courtney and 20 piles on camp McT. Not only is poop ugly and stinky, it's bad for your health. Exposure to animal excrement can cause ringworm, intestinal illnesses and kidney disorders. I think that as well as putting people's health in danger, the beauty of camps Courtney and McT is declining because of the feces left on the sidewalks and in the road.

Bag Dispensers My Gold Award will be implemented in stages. The first stage is plastic bag dispensers where you can find an extra bag in case you forgot yours OR if your furry friend already used up the one you brought with you!

The second stage is plastic bag collection stations located at the Shopettes on Courtney & McTureous, and the Exchange on Courtney Shops. Now, rather than putting your plastic bags in the garbage, or even in recycling where it takes environmental resources to make them into something new ... you can simply drop them off at one of the plastic bag collection stations that will be coming soon!

The third stage is to install additional Dogipots and bag collectors so you won't have to carry that bag with you as far as you do now!



Wondering what you can do to help your community?

- Pick up dog poop. Even if it's not yours. We can all leave our community better than we found it.
- 2. Reuse your plastic bags... put them in the collection bins that will be located at the shopetts on McT and Courtney and the Exchange on Courtney shops, or refill the bag dispenser nearest to your home, and definitely use them to pick up your dogs poop.
