If the position is filled at the lower grade than target grade, the incumbent may be promoted to target non-competitively upon satisfactory completion of the job requirements, recommendation by the supervisor, and subject to meeting time-in-grade and qualification requirements.

**Relocation Allowance will NOT be authorized for the selectee from outside of the commuting area.**

**MAJOR DUTIES**

Serves as journeyman electrician. Installs, maintains and repairs electric wiring systems, related switches, distribution panels and outlet boxes, as well as a wide variety of electrical fixtures, tools and appliances. Following maintenance schedules and Inspects, maintains, cleans, repairs, tests and adjusts electrical buzzer and bell circuits, light sockets, lighting fixtures, fans, switches, office and heating appliances, fire alarms, clocks, rheostats, thermostats and electrical drills, grinders and shop equipment. Tests circuits and equipment and us of voltmeter, ampmeter, wattmeter, megger and ohmmeter. Measures, cuts, threats, bends, assembles and installs conduits, inspecting, splicing and connecting wires to fixtures, outlets, switches, receptacles and power source. Performs other duties as assigned.

**WORKING CONDITION**

Works inside in buildings and shops and outside. Subject to contact with dirt and soiling of hands and clothing, to shocks and burns from high voltage, cuts and brises. May works on high places using a variety of ladders and man-lift.

**QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:**

a. EXPERIENCE

KWB-04: One year of general experience.

KWB-06: One (1) year of general experience plus one year of specialized experience

GENERAL EXPERIENCE: Actual work experience at a trainee, helper or other work related to the trade or craft for which being considered.

SPECIALIZED EXPERIENCE: Experience at the "Junior" or higher level in the work related to trade or craft for which being considered.

**SUBSTITUTION OF EDUCATION FOR EXPERIENCE:** 1. Graduation from technical high school in the field related, successful completion of formal training courses (at least 90 days duration) or possession of a valid license or certificate of competency issued by the ROKG may be substituted for required 1 year of general experience. 2. Graduation from technical junior college in the field to the job for which being considered or possession of a license or certificate of competency issued by the ROKG attesting to proficiency as an industrial engineer in the trade or craft of the job for which being considered may be substituted for 1 year of specialized experience required.

b. ENGLISH LANGUAGE COMPETENCY: The approval of management panel to determine English conversation skill is required.

If you have letter of recommendation, etc., you may present them at the time of an interview, if such an interview is conducted.
