Policy Statement on
Sexual Assault Prevention and Response**



Sexual assault is a crime incompatible with Marine Corps values and goes against everything we strive to do here at MCIPAC-MCBB. All personnel have a responsibility to take care of each other and respect one another. Leaders shall exhibit behavior that supports our ethos and core values. I encourage all personnel to foster healthy relationships and challenge inappropriate acts in the workplaces. Sexual assault destroys unit cohesion, mission readiness and affects the lives of every Marine, Sailor, and civilian impacted by this crime. Sexual assault can occur without regard to gender, spousal relationship, or age. Consent is not given when a person uses force, coercion, or when the victim is asleep, incapacitated, or unconscious.

Individuals who report a sexual assault will be treated with dignity, respect, and empathy. An incident of sexual assault may be reported by filing a Restricted or Unrestricted Report with a Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC) or Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Victim Advocate (SAPR VA). A Restricted Report allows the victim to receive appropriate supportive services without notification of law enforcement or the command. An Unrestricted Report also allows a victim to receive supportive services; however, the command will be immediately notified of the incident and an investigation will be initiated. Leaders will ensure all victims receive the necessary services they desire.

Every member of MCIPAC-MCBB will do their part to prevent this crime from happening within our ranks. We must strive to take care of our fellow Marines, Sailors, and civilians. We are dedicated to serving 24/7 and will always do the right thing, on or off duty. Protect what you have earned and keep our honor clean.
