
CHRO TRAINING ANNOUNCEMENT: CRITICAL THINKING & PROBLEM-SOLVING

This training will be conducted virtually via Adobe Connect.

DESCRIPTION:

A leader's success is highly depended upon his/her ability to critically evaluate data and make effective decisions. This seminar focuses on the process of critical analysis and problem solving. The primary objectives of this seminar are to impart a functional ability to reason well and to improve the participant's analytical skills and instincts. In addition to familiarizing the participant with advanced methods of critical thinking, the course is further designed to aid the participant in understanding the core principles involved in the practice of decision-making.

OUTCOME:

- Identify and understand basic formal and informal fallacies of language and thought.
- Understanding the logical structures of the primary classes of arguments used in the organizational contexts.
- Identify the components of arguments and demonstrate the ability to create complex argument structures in verbal and written forms.
- Utilize the various problem-solving models to resolve organizational issues.
