## **Marine Corps Installations Pacific Brig Visiting Regulations**

- Visitation hours are Saturday, Sunday, and holidays from 1300-1500.
- All visitors are subject to search by metal detector.
- Civilian attire will be in good taste and in accordance with MCBJO 1020.1D Ch. 5 (civilian clothing regulation).
- Foreign nationals must inform Camp Hansen Main Gate security personnel that they are visiting a prisoner at the brig.
- Visits by unmarried persons under the age of 18 years old will need to be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
- Married prisoners are not allowed visitation by unmarried members of the opposite sex unless the visitors are relatives of the prisoner or accompanied by the prisoner's spouse.
- Active duty service members will not be authorized to visit prisoners in a personal capacity without a letter of authorization from their Company Level Commander and approval by the Brig Officer, or designee.
- All personal items such as purses and bags will be placed in the lockers on the Quarter Deck, or left in vehicle.
- No food will be allowed in the visitation area. Bottled water in a clear plastic container is authorized, but must not be shared with the prisoner.
- Supervision of small children is required at all times.
- Embracing may be done at the beginning and ending of the visit, there will be no prolonged embraces.
- Cash, government checks, and money orders may be received by the Receiving and Release NCO for deposit into the prisoners account.

## Visitation Check-In Procedures

- Individuals requesting access to the MCIPAC Brig must have a valid reason, such as command, legal, or family visitation, and must be positively identified by picture identification (ID), i.e., driver license, Active Duty ID, dependent ID, or school ID. Those under the age of ten (10) do not require picture ID, but will be accompanied by an adult with valid identification.
- All visitors, military and civilian, are required to pass through the walk-through metal detector and/or submit to a body scan with a hand-held metal detector. If the metal detector indicates metal is present, the visitor shall be asked for permission to determine the nature of the detected item. If the visitor refuses to comply, they shall not be allowed to visit. Any item not authorized within the MCIPAC Brig may be stowed in a visitor locker or visitor's vehicle.
