



COMMANDING OFFICER'S
POLICY STATEMENT
ON
FAMILY READINESS



Family Readiness is an inherent function of a command regardless of the command's deployment status. First to fight means every Marine is ready for any mission at any time and every family member is prepared. Family Readiness is equally as important as individual, equipment, and combat readiness. It is the ability for Marines and families to balance mission, life, and career events.

Camp Mujuk's Family Readiness Program is part of a larger support network Marines have to ensure they are prepared for any mission. Support comes from the families a Marine is "born into, sworn into, and married into," local Command leadership, and the Marine Corps Community Service team. Each of these entities help Marines meet mission, reach personal goals, and maintain excellence.

The Family Readiness Officer is an essential member of the command and serves as the principle conduit between the command, the unit, and the services and support available to Marines and our families. Small unit leadership is critical to the well-being of our Marines. The Family Readiness Officer is not a substitute for the Chain of Command and will use different means and methods to distribute official communication, provide information, resources and referral services, offer readiness and deployment support, and manage our volunteers.

While Marines and Sailors are responsible for the readiness of their families, the Corps, this command, and the entire Camp Mujuk family is here to provide support to meet that mission.

Remember, families are not only a part of our mission; they are the reason for all of our missions.
